National data from Scholastic Books:

- 91% of children like books they pick out themselves
- 65% of children prefer to read a print book over a digital book
- 50% of children want books that make them laugh; 40% to help them explore new worlds
- 55% of parents say a book has helped their child get through a difficult time
- 33% of teachers have time during the school day for independent reading
- 41% of children read for fun 1- 4 times per week; this number shrinks as children age

Reading just 20 minutes a day means a child is exposed to 1.8 million words per year and scores in the 90 percentile on standardized tests.

Facts from the Literacy Project:

- 3 out of 4 people on food assistance cannot read
- 3 out of 5 people incarcerated in American prisons cannot read
- Middle class families book to child ratio 13:1 13 books for every child
- Low-income families book to child ratio 1:300 1 book for every 300 children
- 61% of low-income families don't have a single children's book in their home
